A Few Words from the General Manager

Having left Sussex for Langdale towards the end of last year, it will be quite a time before I will be able to dispense with the Cumbrian title of 'offcomer'. With rucksack packed ready for the spectacular Langdale hills, it is with some surprise I realise that Spring is already here and I have yet to venture forth to the mountains beckoning from my office window. Pressure of work is probably a poor excuse, but the weather is now brightening and quite a lot of work is underway at Langdale; we hope these improvements will meet with approval on your next visit.

Those of you who have been frustrated by the inadequacy of our telephone system will be pleased to know that we have now placed an order with British Telecom for a completely new system. So life with the outside world should be somewhat less complicated, which may perhaps be of questionable value to those of you who come away to Langdale for its peace and tranquility and to get away from it all!

Plans are well in hand to upgrade Purdey's restaurant, and indeed to make it bigger; do try it on your next visit. There's a new menu and pricing structure that hopefully will appeal to the majority.

In order to give us much needed extra space, we have had to encroach into Hobson's which will now become the lounge and bar area for the restaurant. To make this possible, we will be knocking a hole through between the restaurant and Hobson's, thus enabling the present lounge area in Purdey's to be used as an extension of the restaurant. If you still want to use Hobson's as your 'local', the further good news is that you don't have to eat in Purdey's to use the bar.

In conjunction with this expansion, we will also be using the restaurant for all meals in future, which will enable us to concentrate on operating just the one kitchen instead of two. This means the Tamarind will operate a Club bar snack service to order, catering for less expensive and more casual meals, while Wainwright's offers the third choice for a hearty Lakeland pub meal.

A number of interesting changes are being made in the Club, and we very much hope that owners will take advantage of our 50% Club Membership discount if they live sufficiently close to Langdale to make this worthwhile. You will be pleased to know that the changing rooms have been given a much needed face lift, the gymnasium enlarged, with improvements to both the size and scope of the Club shop and a more attractive reception area.

I look forward to welcoming you to Langdale.

COMMENTS FROM THE OWNERS CLUB COMMITTEE

1989 AGM

The foggy weather, and possibly the retiming of the seventh AGM, which was held at Leicester, combined to reduce the attendance to about 80 members. The minutes of the meeting are included with this copy of Views; it would be useful if anyone wishing to comment or raise any matter prompted by the minutes would contact one of the elected members of the Committee as soon as possible rather than wait until the next AGM. Following the complete takeover by Scottish and Newcastle, changes are taking place at Langdale and we need to be appraised of members' views so that we may react quickly and positively to proposals by the Management Company.

May we apologise again for the change in the date of the AGM which was due to circumstances outside our control - and we did not contribute to the necessary extra mailing costs, etc.

CHANGES TO THE COMMITTEE

The outcome of one of the changes referred to above is that Mike Bevans has left Langdale and we welcome David Fairs as the new General Manager of the Langdale complex. He and Keith Karlberg, the Financial Controller, are the appointees of the Management Company to the Lodge Owners' Committee.

NOMINATIONS TO THE COMMITTEE: LEGAL ADVISERS

May we remind owners that seconded nominations for membership of the Committee should be made in writing before the 1st July. Mr Dale Watler, who stands down by rotation, has expressed his willingness to stand again.

With the passage of time, we come across more and more legal and insurance matters where we would feel happier if we had competent legal advice. Whilst there are more of them, they are not great in number, and we do not feel a sub-committee is warranted. However, the issues are usually important and we would welcome one or two volunteers to whom problems could be referred. Would anyone who is prepared to act in this capacity please write to the Chairman?

MICROWAVE OVENS

Taking account of the recent government guidelines on microwave cookers, we have selected NEFF 6155 free standing microwaves, which were delivered on 16th March.

This high quality unit has an easy to use control panel and wipe-clean interior, with adequate capacity and power, to ensure that this will be a useful addition to your kitchen.

In order to ensure that you get the very

best performance from this new addition, we will be equipping each lodge and apartment with appropriate microwave cookware.

HOUSEKEEPING AND NEW SUB-COMMITTEE

Gay Westwood has recently arrived as the new Executive Housekeeper. At an early stage she was concerned with the condition of the bed linen and because of this, and operational advantages, the bed linen and curtains are to be replaced.

This fact, together with the reality that more and more items in the older lodges are beginning to need replacement, leaves us mere male chauvinistic mortals on the Committee only too aware of how poorly equipped we are to make decisions on colours, styles, fabrics, design, etc. You may well think we have demonstrated this when you see the new bed linen for instance!!!

We feel that the stage has been reached where a small sub-committee should be formed of persons of either sex who have somewhat more experience than your Committee in interior design and household effects, so that we may be advised in such matters. Would anyone interested in serving on such a sub-committee please write to the Chairman indicating their outstanding qualities for being on such a group?

MANAGEMENT FEES

Management fees become effective from May 1990. May we emphasise one point from the minutes of the AGM in that the management fee MUST be paid by the owner(s) of the week(s) regardless of whether the lodge is occupied or not, and regardless of whether it is available for rent, for sale, or swapping 'internally' or through the RCI scheme.

As you may realise, the overall increase is just over 14%. In accordance with the agreement reached with the Management Company in February 1988, the increase should be approximately 7% above inflation, ie: 15%.

For the first time the Management Company will not be providing a subsidy towards costs. However, the Management Company will not receive any part of the 15% fee to which it is entitled.

Your Committee remains very much aware of the increasing levels of Management Fees. With the assistance of the Management Company it is hoped that fees in future years will be increased only by inflation.

We can offer help with outdoor pursuits, either just for fun or as a learning and team building experience. Activities range from water sports to microliting and JCB digger racing!



Picture of the Year

Looking through the snippets of news carried in the local press last year, this picture of Groundsman, Peter Head Monaghan, just had to be the most arresting. Peter, who is in charge of keeping Langdale beautifully landscaped, and its flora and fauna in good order, is pictured here in a driving rainstorm, demonstrating one of the various jobs and skills needed here on the Estate. His audience is a group of enthralled teenagers attending a Langdale open day.

Peter is a member of and strongly supports the Langdale/Ambleside Mountain Rescue Team, a purely voluntary organisation of locals who are on constant call to aid walkers and climbers in the fells which surround the Estate.

This is one of the busiest teams in the country. The team has in the past carried out two rescues on the Estate itself, and last summer picked up below Crinkle Crags, a couple of lodge owners, who had been

stranded by poor weather. They were finally located by the mountain rescue team who saw the light from a pack of Langdale matches that they struck to attract the team's attention.

Peter has now been joined in the Mountain Rescue Team by his dog, Glen, who has just passed the Search and Rescue Dog Association's four day Assessment Course Keswick. In the past two years, dogs 'belonging' to this charitable association have been involved in over 100 searches for missing persons throughout the mountains of England. In addition, 50 dogs were active in the Lockerbie air disaster.

Two year old border collie, Glen, has after one year of gruelling training reached 'novice' class. He'll work another year in snow, high winds and heavy rain to gain the full title of Search Dog, but he is already being used on call-outs by the Mountain Rescue Teams.
