Beware of Timeshare Sales Companies

Langdale does not in any circumstances share details of timeshare owners with other organisations. Some owners have recently reported telephone calls from two companies – Extra Weeks and Planet Vacations – claiming to have information about Langdale owners, and in one case claiming to be working on behalf of Langdale. Neither company is working

on behalf of Langdale, and we do not believe that they have obtained copies of our database. We are pursuing enquiries as appropriate, and in the meantime owners are advised to be extremely cautious about any claims made by the companies. Owners should be particularly careful about revealing any personal information.




News from Purdey's 🍪

Timeshare Refurbishments







Bathrooms

Plans are being developed for the next round of refurbishment of timeshare units. Water supply, bathrooms and boilers are coming together into one coherent scheme, building on the experience gained in the last couple of years. Most of the lodges on the main Estate use water supplied via large storage tanks on the hill below Founders' Seat. We are looking into replacing them with a new single, larger and raised tank to get better pressure. At the same time the possibility of using pressurised hot water systems is being explored, together with the appropriate boilers. That would give a good basis for the completion of the bathroom refurbishment programme (in lodges and Chapel Stile).

TV Update

TV and entertainment systems remain under review. Our aerial contractor is working on a proposal for a network across the Estate to deliver a good digital TV signal. In the meantime, new developments come along all the time, and the arrival of Freesat may be a very good option for Langdale. Owners' views on Bang & Olufson against a standard flatscreen set have been heavily in favour of the standard model. We are currently considering a range of models from Panasonic, Sony and LG, though the final decision on model will not be taken until early next year, in order to take advantage of the latest developments in TV technology. The middle of next year remains the target for installation of new TV and entertainment systems in the timeshare units.

Furniture

The trial leather furniture for the lounges has not resulted in the "wow" response for which we were hoping. The search continues, hopefully sharing refurbishment practice with the experience of other five star resorts, and also linking in with plans to appoint an interior designer to prepare for refurbishment of the lounge and kitchen areas.

Lodge Living Area Refurbishment

The objectives for the new lodge living area designs have been set. The design will concentrate on taking the original concept and creating a new 21st Century feel. The very best of the original design will be blended with the new. The design process will include both living areas and kitchens and will be incorporating the quality, comfort and design needed to stand the test of time. Modern products, techniques and finishes will be used whilst staying true to the original thematic Scandinavian style – creating a timeless feel.









The Terrace gets a new look

In late April this year we closed The

Terrace restaurant for five days in order to refurbish the kitchen and redecorate

the restaurant areas. The kitchen equipment was replaced and saw the installation of a charcoal fired 'Josper' oven. The oven imported from Spain is one of only a handful in the north of the country.

Paul and Linda also took the opportunity to give the menu a more contemporary Mediterranean feel whilst still using good quality locally sourced ingredients.

So far this combination has proved very successful.



Repairs to the tarn at Lodges 57 to 61 are due to take place shortly. This should result in much improved water levels throughout the year. The works will take four to five weeks and need to be scheduled outside the winter months. We apologise in advance for any disruption, but hope that owners will feel that the end result will make it well worthwhile.



Many owners will be pleased to see that coffee filter machines have been restored to the timeshare units. There has been continuing high demand, and a suitably-sized machine has been sourced which will meet the needs of coffee drinkers without taking up too much space. The search is on for a small food processor and hopefully these will be returning soon – in the meantime, food processors are available on request from Housekeeping.

Sustainable Energy

During September and October this year we will be installing a Biomass Boiler to provide 1.5 million KW or approximately one third of the Estate's heating needs. The boiler burns wood chip which is a carbon-lean source of sustainable energy. The fuel (wood) will be sourced within 25 miles of the Estate. The use of wood fuel will provide cost savings, reduce our reliance upon LPG and benefit local biodiversity by helping to promote the management of local woodlands.
